APPLICATION FOR CONSERVATION GRANT

EAIA supports the preservation of historic trades and crafts. To this end, it established a conservation grant of up to \$3000 to support conservation planning, object treatment services, educational interpretive services, and supplies related to sharing historic trades with the public.

This grant is open to historic sites and museums who have 501(c)(3) status and that are open to the public on a regular basis.

The project must be completed within one (1) year of the award. A report must be submitted to EAIA detailing the results of the project, including photographs and a final budget. Failure to submit the final report will disqualify the organization from future EAIA grants and/or scholarships.
